30th Annual Meeting of the Paul Green Foundation November 5th 2011

The Paul Green Foundation will hold its 30th Annual Meeting this year.

See the notes from the very first meeting in 1982:

“The organizational meeting of the Paul Green Foundation, Inc. was held in Chapel Hill on August 29, 1982. Present were Elizabeth Lay Green, Paul E. Green, Jr. and Rhoda H. Wynn, Foundation Trustees and Incorporators.

“It was moved, seconded and voted unanimously to ask Byrd G. Cornwell, Betsy G. Moyer and Janet G. Catlin to serve as Trustees. Nomination of additional Trustees was deferred until the list of recommended persons has been compiled and circulated by Dr. Green. It was agreed by those present that the By-Laws should be presented for adoption at the first meeting of the full Board of Trustees, being a minimum of ten.

“Paul Green, Jr. nominated Elizabeth Lay Green for President of the Foundation, motion seconded and election by acclamation. On a second motion by Dr. Green, Byrd G. Cornwell was nominated for Vice-President, seconded and elected by unanimous vote. Rhoda Wynn nominated Paul Green, Jr. for the dual office of Secretary-Treasurer seconded and elected unanimously.

“Rhoda Wynn reported that she had requested a change in the telephone directory listing to the Paul Green Foundation, Inc. to meet the new directory deadline. Meeting was adjourned.”
